(c) Welland Wanderer  Cilr Underwood updated the Council on the current position with the Welland Wanderer. A mas been scheduled for 7th February to discuss the future of the service. Parish Councils had sked to confirm their level of funding for the forthcoming year and a response was still at from NNC regarding the £1500 outstanding match funding and the provision of any future fur It was expected that the service would continue until late summer if no further funding received.
